- Increase short-term parking space availability by unlocking access to 'No Parking' zones to delivery vehicles
- Reduce the number of parking infractions
- Improve the management of curbside space in Toronto

FAQ: Frequently Asked Questions

Where will this permit allow me to park?

This permit will allow drivers to park in designated all-day "No Parking" zones along city streets. There will be restrictions on the permit in instances where safety is a concern. For example, select "No Parking" zones will remain in effect during rush hour periods, where bike lanes exist or within certain distances of a traffic control signal or pedestrian crossover to ensure safe and unimpeded traffic movement.

How much will the permit cost?

The cost of the permit is still being developed, in consultation with stakeholders in the industry but the cost will be on a per fleet vehicle basis. Each permit issued by the City of Toronto will come with a sticker that will need to be affixed to the windshield of the vehicle. We welcome feedback on fair pricing ranges from OTA members.

How long will the permit allow me to park for?

The duration we are considering is between 15 to 30 minutes in length, recognizing that the time needed for deliveries varies by area. We welcome your feedback on the amount of parking time this permit should allow.
